Opening the Churches for Public Private Prayer

It must be noted that the current instruction to open the Churches is to allow for private prayer and nothing else. The churches are as yet not open for regular Worship and services. Furthermore, the churches are not a tourist attraction for visitors to walk around access is allowed for prayer and reflection only.

Plans to open on 15th June Alnmouth and Longhoughton are similar and in summary

- 1. Door to be open from 9.00/10.00 am 3.00 pm
- 2. All books, candles and prayer sheets to be moved out
- 3. Clear signage and instruction
- 4. Entry is directed to a prayer area for 2 people
- 5. No one to enter the building if 2 people already in
- 6. Sanitiser available at entry and when leaving
- 7. Accessible pews to be cleaned on closing the church.

Lesbury needs to finalise arrangements but will be on similar lines but may not open until later in the week. Howick Church will not open; all other buildings on the Estate are closed and with more visitors to the gardens along with the "tourist" atmosphere it was felt that there would be difficulty in controlling admission to the building without supervision. Notices to be placed on the church to explain this and directing anyone who wish for time to pray and reflect to go to Longhoughton church.

Thought there are notable concerns about the churches being unsupervised during the opening times, it was generally agreed that Alnmouth and Longhoughton Churches would open on 15th June as arranged and that Lesbury would follow when plans were complete. It was suggested that an email review in a week would help and that serious problems should be shared immediately.
